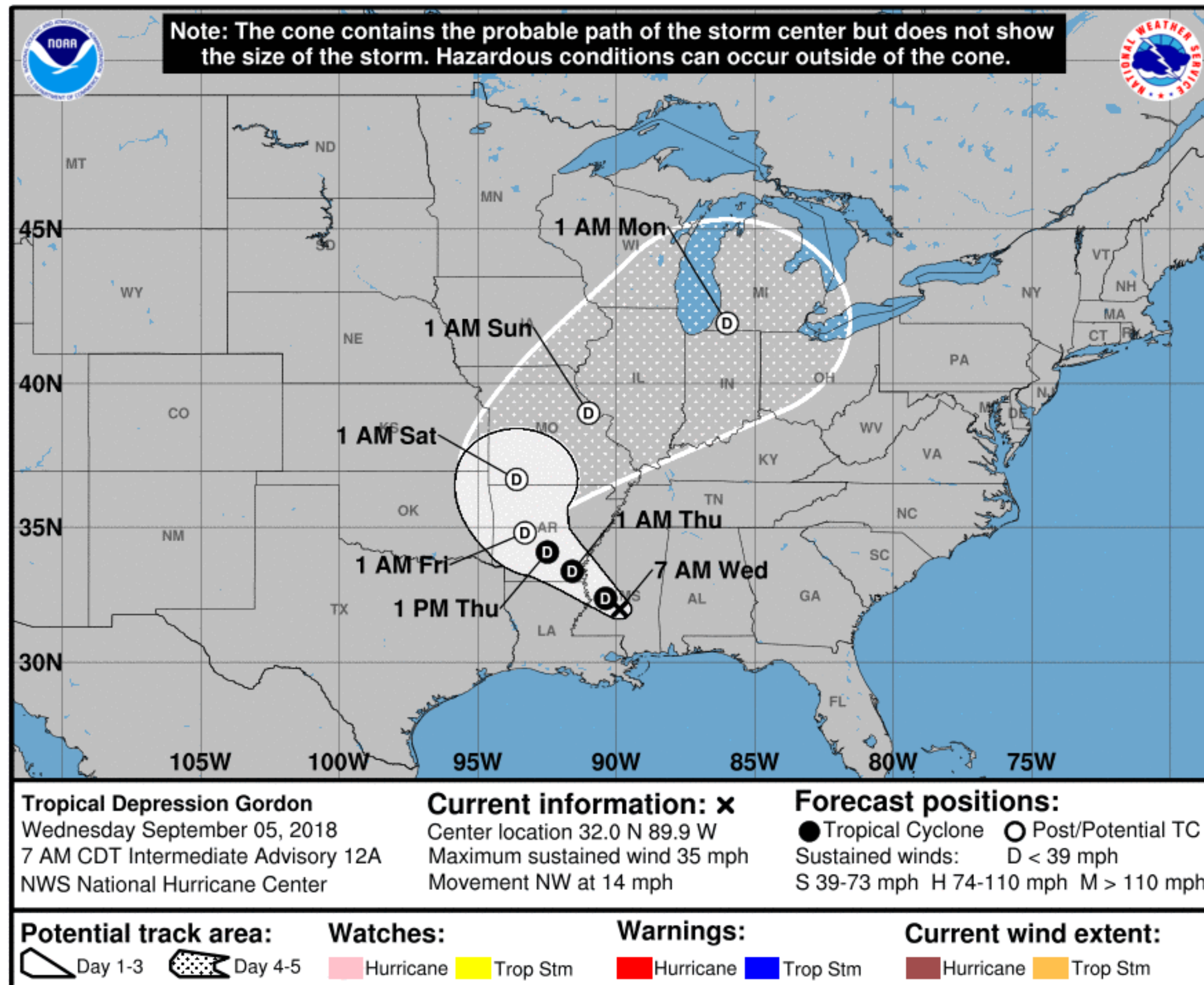
- Gordon continues to weaken and move northwestward toward northeast Louisiana
- Few impacts felt across Louisiana as the storm shifted farther east than expected
- A few tropical storm force gusts reported as a few showers moved across the area on the far west side of the storm
- Scattered showers and storms still possible today, and some could produce high rainfall rates

Situation Overview



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- TD Gordon currently located over central Mississippi and continues to move northwest

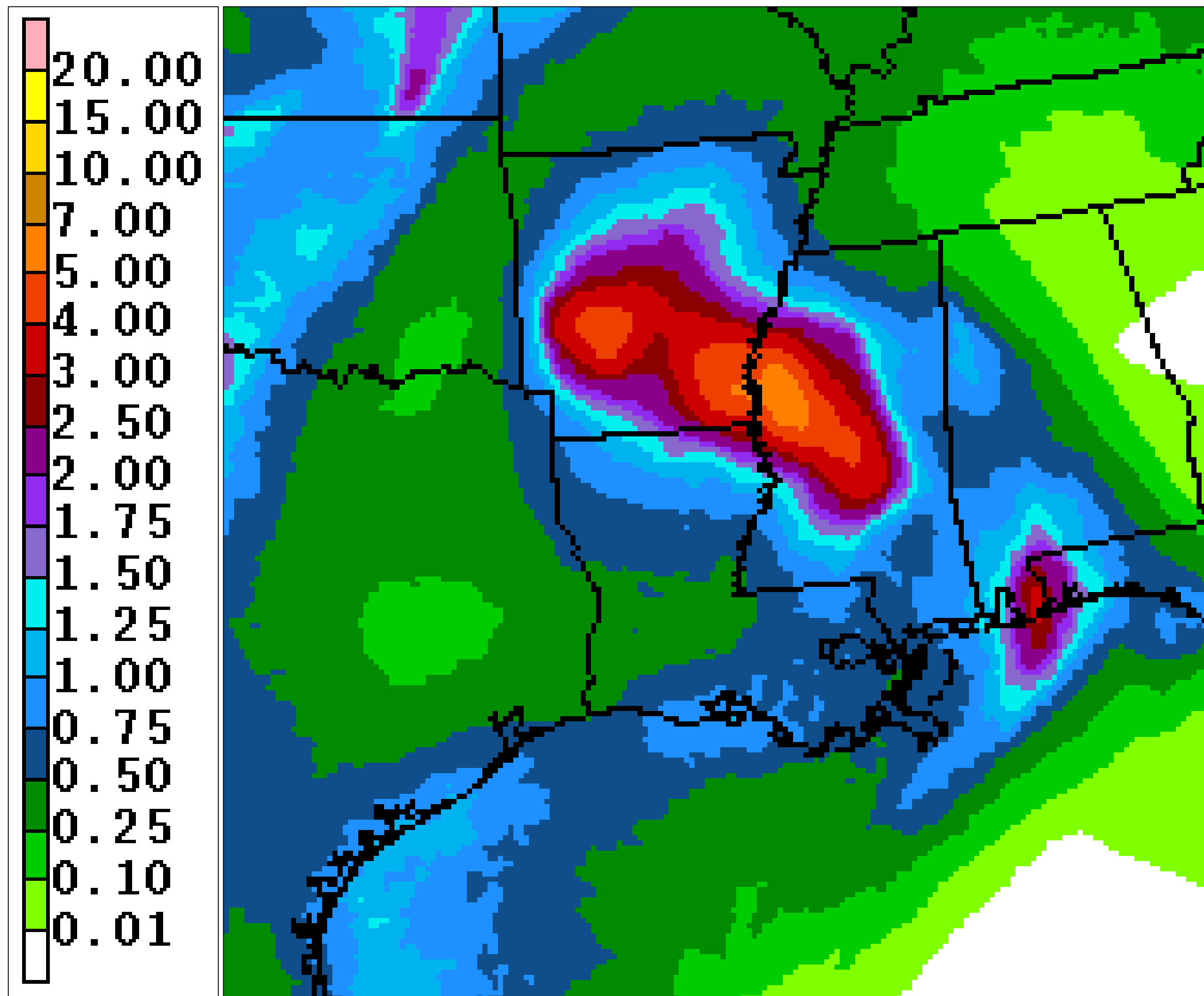
NOTE: Do not focus on the exact track. Impacts can occur well outside the area enclosed by the cone.

Rainfall Forecast Next 48 hours



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- Generally less than an inch of rainfall is forecast in the next 2 days
- However, locally higher amounts will be possible with any heavier thunderstorms

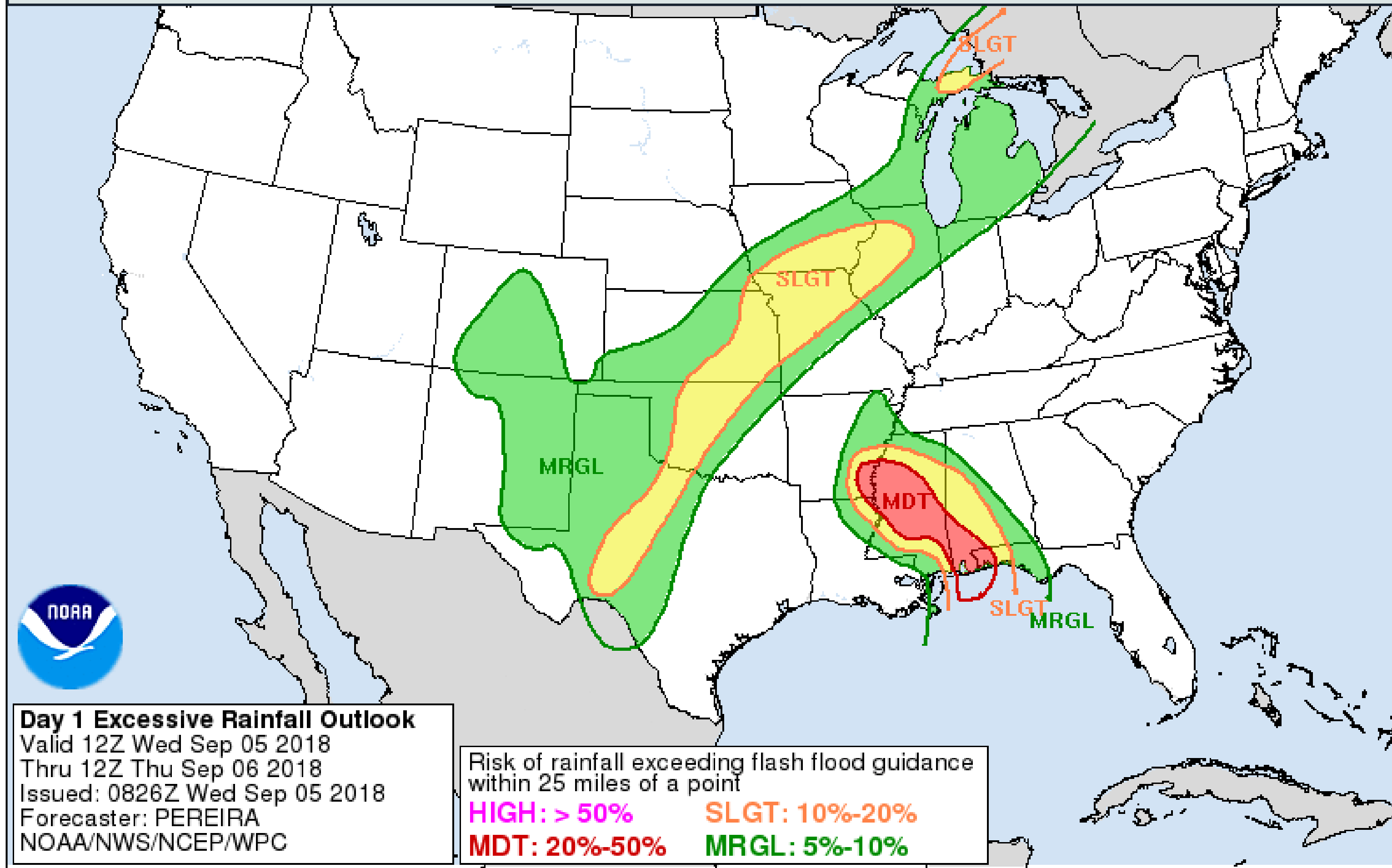
Excessive Rainfall Outlook



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Excessive Rainfall Outlook Valid Today



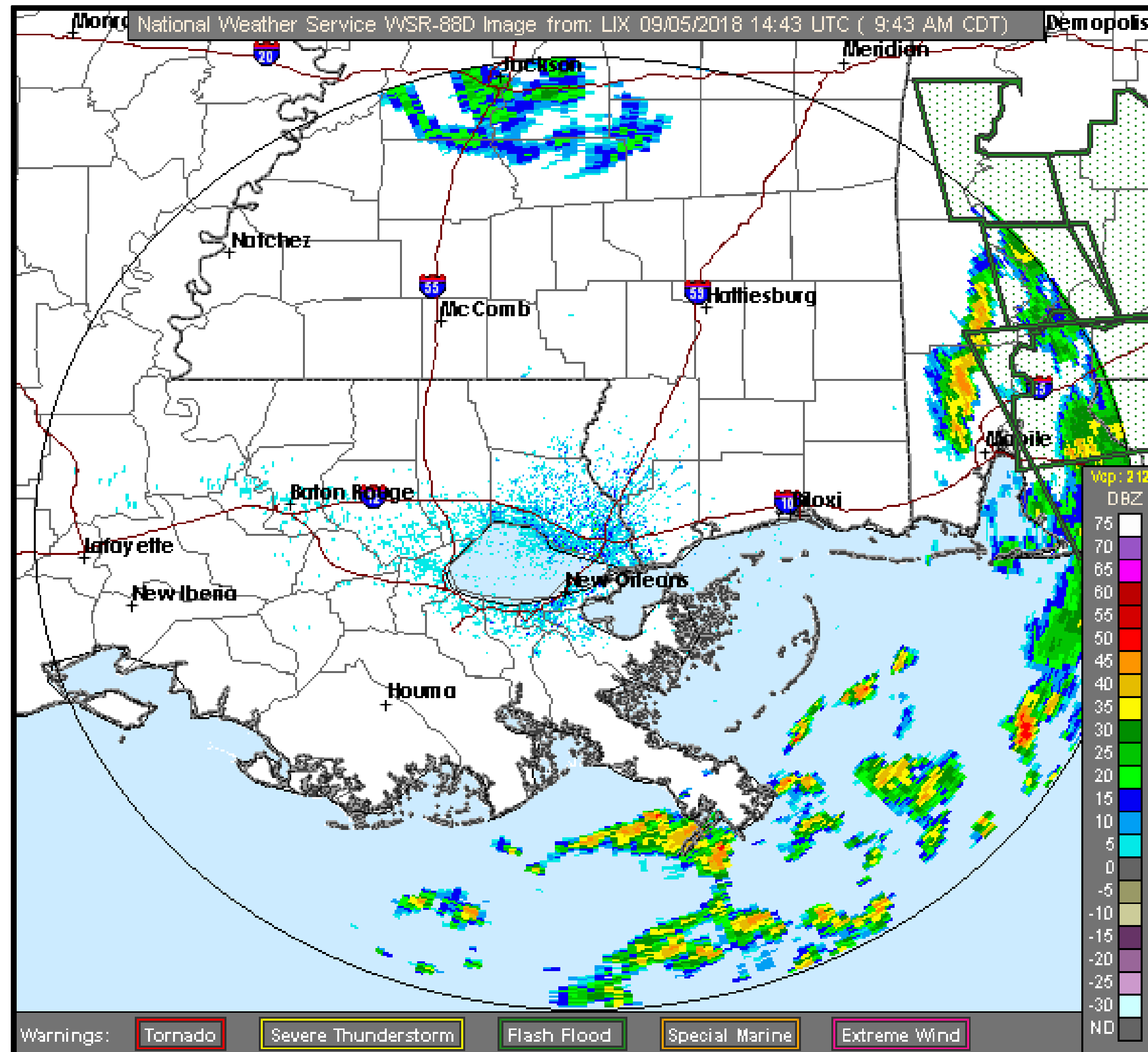
- There is little risk of flash flooding across southeast Louisiana today
- However, any showers/storms will be capable of producing high rainfall rates and could lead to temporary street flooding

Current Radar View



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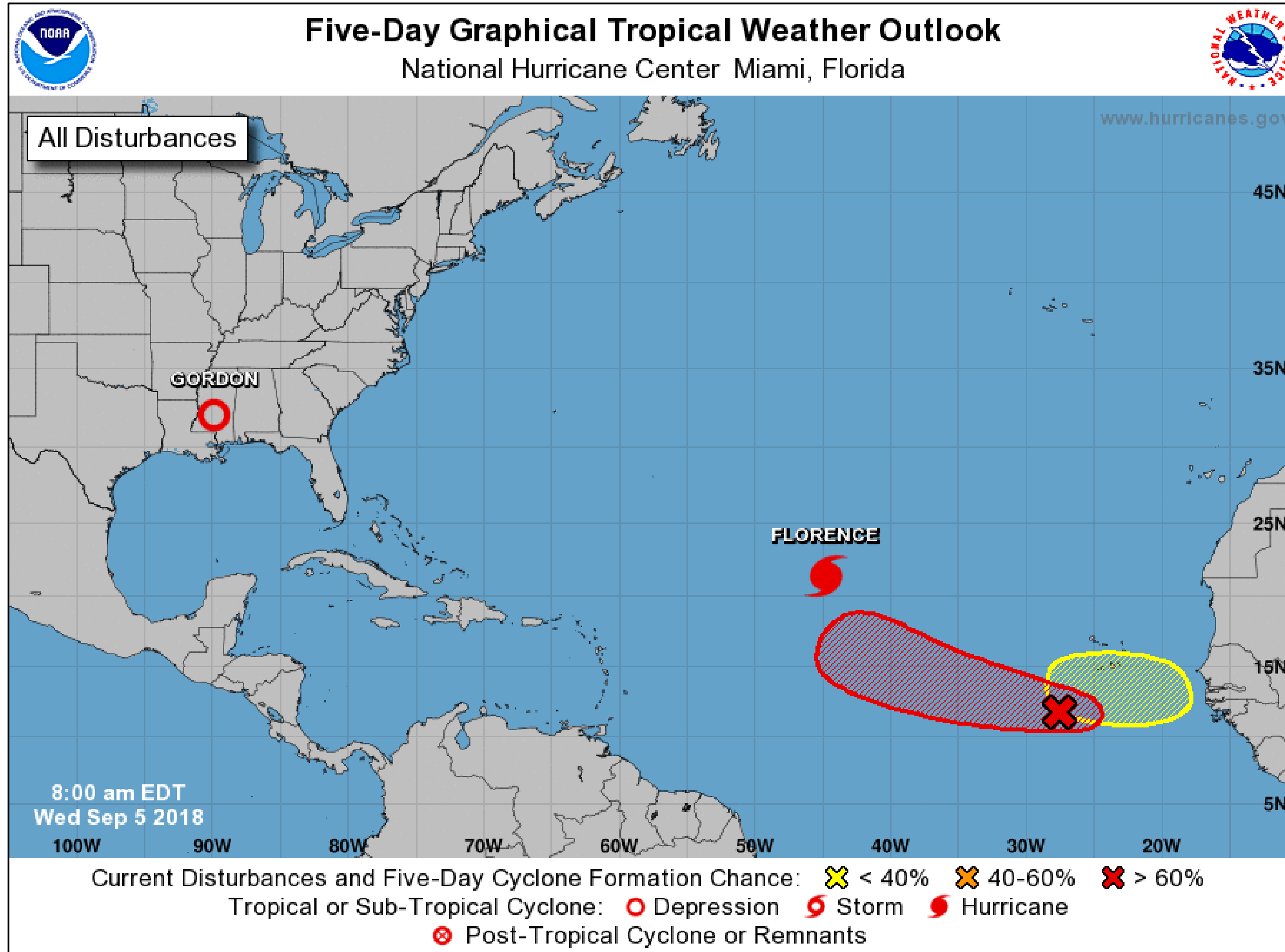


- Showers and storms will primarily be limited to coastal areas through the morning
- Scattered showers and storms are still possible this afternoon

Tropical Weather Outlook



New Orleans/Baton Rouge
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- Active period in the tropical Atlantic continues, but this is normal
- Climatological peak of the Atlantic hurricane season is the week surrounding September 10
