**<div>SITUATION: &nbsp;<div>&nbsp;</div>A line of thunderstorms is expected to move through the state on Saturday morning and continuing Saturday evening before tapering off Sunday. Most of central and south Louisiana will be under a SLIGHT risk of severe weather, with northern Louisiana under a MARGINAL risk. &nbsp;<div>&nbsp;</div>Rainfall from 1 to 3 inches with isolated higher amounts will be possible are expected to occur within an 18-20 hour period. Also, there is a chance for some strong to severe storms, including tornadoes, damaging winds, and hail. The forecast areas for Louisiana have been broken down below. &nbsp;</div>**

**<div>FORECAST for LOUISIANA&nbsp;</div>**

**<div>Southwest Louisiana: &nbsp;<div>&nbsp;</div>Showers and storms will become widespread on Saturday as a strong upper-level storm system approaches the region. At this time there is a slight chance for severe weather on Saturday and Saturday night, with large hail and damaging winds being the primary threats. Tornado activity will also be possible during this time. Dry weather is expected to return by late Sunday and continue through the early part of next week.</div>**

**<div>Southeast Louisiana: A vigorous storm system will bring the threat of strong and severe thunderstorms over the outlook area possibly as early as Saturday afternoon but mainly during the evening and overnight hours Saturday night. Confidence continues to increase in the risk of severe weather and all modes of severe weather will be possible. The main questions right now are the extent and severity of strong and severe weather.</div>**
