**SITUATION:**  
**Tropical Storm Barry continues to strengthen and heavy rain continues to be the greatest concern. The storm is about 80 nm S of the mouth of the Mississippi River moving west at 5 mph with maximum sustained winds of 40 mph. There is a danger of life-threatening storm surge along the coast of southern and southeastern Louisiana. The highest storm surge is expected between the mouth of the Atchafalaya River and Shell Beach. The slow movement of Barry will result in a long duration heavy rainfall and flood event through the weekend into early next week. Widespread heavy rain could lead to significant and possibly life threatening flash flooding beginning as early as Friday. Hurricane conditions are expected along the Louisiana coast. Tropical storm conditions are expected to arrive in the Hurricane Warning area by Friday.**
