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**SITUATION:
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**As of 1000 hours 25 Jun2012, NWS/NHC is reporting the following on TROPICAL
STORM DEBBY.
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**As the accompanying graphics show, DEBBY has shifted drastically to the east with
landfall now projected along the northern Florida peninsula late this week as a tropical
storm. This has greatly reduced the threat and impact to Louisiana. As this is a slow
moving system, it will still be monitored for any future changes in its track that could
affect Louisiana.
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**The revised impact is provided below:
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**Southeast Louisiana:
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**All tropical storm warnings have been cancelled for Louisiana. A coastal flood advisory
is in effect for southeast Louisiana to include Lake Ponchartrain and Lake
Maurepas.
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**Minor coastal flooding impacts are tides of 1-2 feet above normal through Tuesday
with some locations east of the levee in Plaquemines Parish and Shell Beach seeing tides
of up to 3 feet above normal Water levels should subside by mid-week.
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**Small craft advisories are in effect for offshore waters east of Port Fourchon and
include Breton and Chandeleur Sounds.
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**North winds of 20-30 knots over coastal waters can be expected through Monday.
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**Seas near shore will be 5-7 feet with offshore waters reaching 7-10 feet
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**No rain impact and no wind impact over land is expected
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**Southwest Louisiana:
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**Increased tides of 1 foot above normal today receding Monday
