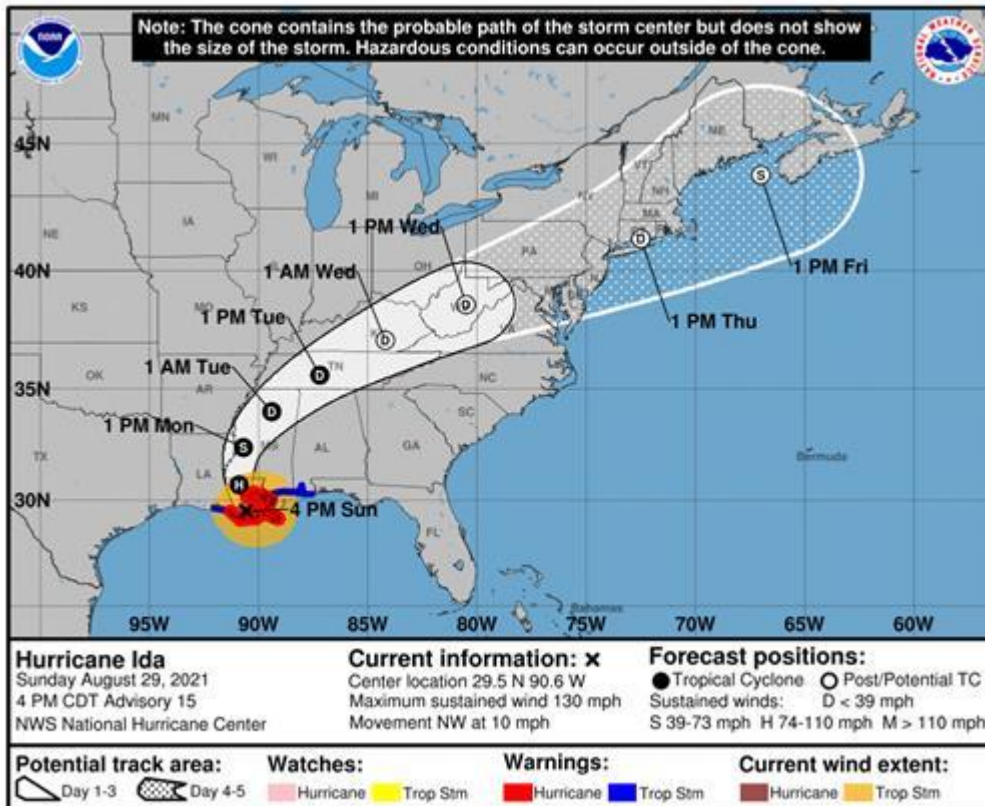


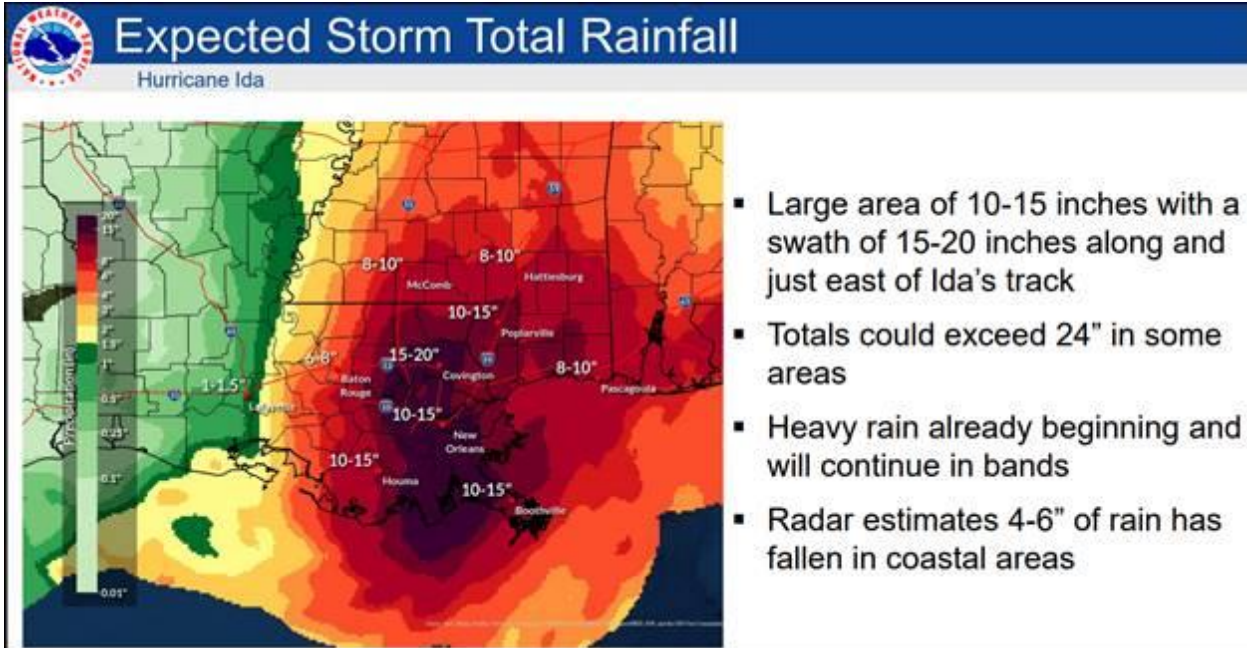

State EOC Activation Level: Level I (Full Activation)
WebEOC Incident: 21-018 TC Ida - Statewide – August
State Declaration Proclamation Number: 165 JBE 2021

SITUATION: At 4 PM, Hurricane Ida was located 45 miles southwest of New Orleans, Louisiana, with maximum sustained winds of 130 mph and moving northwest near 10 mph. On the forecast track, the center of Ida will move farther inland over southeastern Louisiana tonight and move well inland over portions of western Mississippi Monday and Monday night and across the Tennessee Valley on Tuesday. Ida is an extremely dangerous category 4 Hurricane on the Saffir-Simpson Hurricane Wind Scale. Rapid weakening is expected during the next day; however, Ida is forecast to remain a Hurricane through late tonight and remain a Tropical Storm until Monday afternoon.

Impacts of Hurricane Ida across southeast Louisiana include a large swath of significant wind damage, significant and life-threatening storm surge, excessive rainfall and inland flooding. A large area of 10-15" of rain is expected with a swath of 15-20" of rain near the center of the track is expected, including in the metro Baton Rouge and New Orleans areas. Localized amounts in excess of 24" are possible. The heaviest rainfall is expected today and Monday. There is a threat of weak/short-lived tornadoes across southeast Louisiana.

 - All licensed facilities will utilize the ESF 8 Portal to report bed availability and facility status for the duration of the event.
 - Surge Ambulances
 - 26 state surge units all currently assigned. 47 Federal units all currently assigned. Units are doing 911 support, evacuation missions and transports to MSNS in regions 1, 2, 3, and 4.
 - Mega-Shelter/ Medical Special Needs Shelter
 - Region 6 Mega Shelter. LDH and DCFS staffing now; BCFS will arrive Sunday to onboard and will take over Monday AM. 200 bed capacity. Confirmation forthcoming on additional beds.
 - Region 7 MSNS. Being set up now for opening later today. LDH and DCFS are staffing; BCFS will take over Tuesday. 200 bed capacity. Confirmation forthcoming on additional beds.
 - Region 2 MSNS. Field house is currently be staged today.
 - Prescriptions: Walgreens and CVS have been placed on standby to support shelter mission.
 - Testing/Vaccinations
 - Any shelters that are set up will have testing and vaccine administration available onsite.
 - Planning to pull down LANG COVID testing and vaccination sites at noon (8.27) in Regions 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 & 9 due to Ida.
 - Oxygen
 - The oxygen contract has been activated to stage 500 cylinders of oxygen in Regions 1, 2, 4, and 5.

 - 4 hospital evacuating
 - Facilities are monitoring weather updates, reviewing plans, and making Shelter in Place preparations.
 - An ESF8 portal notification was forwarded to hospitals regarding the opening of the At Risk Registry for patient tracking.

 - 22 Nursing homes are planning to evacuate.
 - Assisted Living
 - 18 Assisted Living Facilities are planning to evacuate.
 - Intermediate Care Facilities
 - 61 Intermediate Care Facilities have evacuated.

- Coordinating with our SAR partners to finalize SAR plans.
- Coordinating a recon flight with LANG for damage assessments and likely places for hasty searches tomorrow morning.
- Coordinating with other state wildlife agencies for possible EMAC requests.
- Prepared to move ALPHA Teams as soon as it is safe into impacted areas to begin SAR operations.
- BRAVO Teams are on stand-by status.

Region 1

Jefferson Parish (Declaration Submitted 8/27)

- Public and Catholic Schools: Closed 8/30
- The Mayor of Grand Isle issued a Mandatory Evacuation at 11 am on 8/27.
 - Grand Isle Mayor advises Grand Isle is 95% evacuated.
- The Mayor of Lafitte issued a Voluntary Evacuation for the Lafitte Barataria, and Crown Point Areas effective 9 am on 8/27.
- SAR Teams are on standby at this time.
- Items for shelter have been staged at PARD Playground. Hygiene kits requested through state WebEOC
- O2 tanks and supplies have been staged on the EB and WB, additional nasal cannulas requested.
- Reports of a building collapse on Grand Isle at the Community Center. There are 12 people inside, all are safe waiting on USCG to respond.

Orleans Parish (Declaration Submitted 8/28)

- The City of New Orleans is calling for a voluntary evacuation of areas outside the levee system, including Irish Bayou, Venetian Isles, and Lake Catherine, beginning at 6 pm 8/27.

Plaquemines Parish (Declaration Submitted 8/27)

- Plaquemines Medical Center will stop operations effective at 1500 hours 8/27.
- Plaquemines Parish personnel are currently closing various floodgates and placing sandbags in areas of concern throughout the parish.
- Public schools and parish offices closed 8/30.
- Evacuation details 8/28 Update:
 - Mandatory Evacuation - Entire Eastbank; Oakville Floodgate to Venice on Westbank
 - Voluntary Evacuation for the Entire Belle Chasse Area
- 1130 hours - Riverbend Nursing Home has evacuated and headed to their Point to Point at Magnolia United Methodist Church in Baton Rouge
- PPSO is anticipated full evacuation of Detention Center by this afternoon.
- 1330 hours 34 residents and 10 pets are being transported to our Point to Point with the West Monroe Sports Complex.
- Evacuation Orders have been issued.
- Plaquemines Parish will active our Point to Point agreement with the City of West Monroe. Director Harvey spoke with Neal Brown in Ouachita and advised we will have evacuees enroute on 8/28/21 @ approximately 1100 hours.
- HWY 23 Closures:
 - The Floodgate in Oakville is CLOSED. Emergency Bypass on MRL
 - Supersacks & Limestone placed across HWY 23 just north of P66 Refinery, closing the gap between Jesult Bend & MRL.
 - Plaquemines Parish personnel closed various floodgates and placed sandbags in areas of concern throughout the parish.
- Reports that the Chalmette Ferry broke loose and is stuck on a rock levee.

St. Bernard Parish *(Declaration Submitted 8/26)*

- Public Schools and parish offices: Closed 08/30
- Canals pumped down in anticipation of heavy rainfall.
- Rolling rock dam in place in Florrisant.
- Multiple sandbag locations 8/28.
- Sheriff has evacuated the Parish Correctional Facility.
- All parish SAR assets have been pre-staged in lower St. Bernard. LA ANG SAR assets in place also 8/29.
- All emergency preparations have been completed 8/29.

Region 2

Ascension Parish *(Declaration Submitted 8/27)*

East Baton Rouge Parish *(Declaration Submitted 8/27)*

- All parish departments are following hurricane checklist preparations.
- All equipment was inspected and staged for response.
- Search and Rescue Teams on standby.
- Shelter equipment & PPE staged for deployment.
- EOC staffing are on standby.
- Public schools and parish offices closed 8/30.
- Shelter at FG Clark operated by ARC will open 29 AUG 21 @ 0600 Hours. Capacity = 237

East Feliciana Parish *(Declaration Submitted 8/27)*

- All Parish Schools and Offices closed Monday 8/30 and 8/31.
- DPW staging emergency equipment for rapid deployment.
- Stockpiled and prepared local sandbag POD sites. Will confer with the sheriff on opening times.
- Due to COVID, some of the first responder assets are thin to include vessel operators.
 - Working locally with CERT members to cover down. The CERT team is on alert.
- Public notified that Emergency Response will be suspended at +40mph sustained winds but call 911 to document the emergency.

Iberville Parish (*Declaration Submitted 8/26*)

- Iberville will be opening 3 shelters of last resort.

Livingston Parish (*Declaration Submitted 8/27*)

- Setting up a standby list for EOC and sheltering staff once activation is needed.
- Pre-storm shelter opened at Live Oak Jr. Have two standby shelters for after the storm at Albany High and Walker Jr. if needed. Requested ARC support for these two after the storm.

Pointe Coupee Parish (*Declaration Submitted 8/27*)

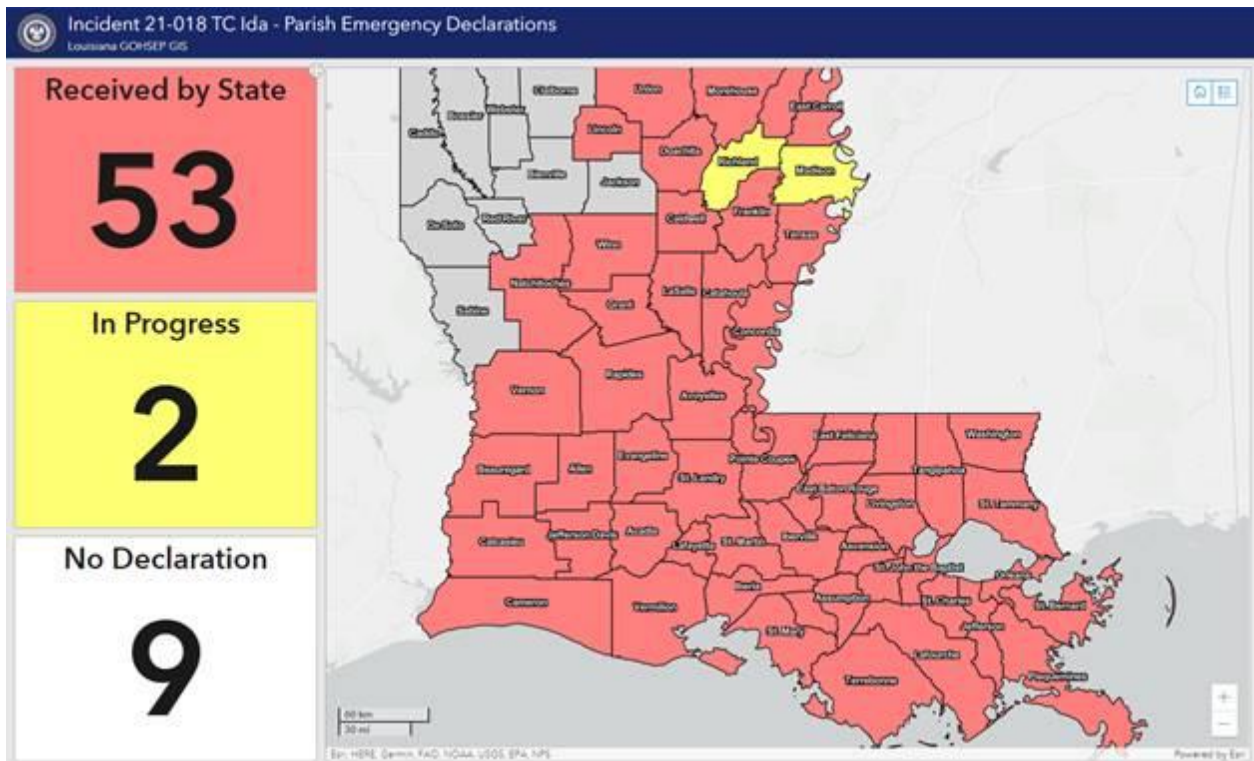
