SITUATION: Hurricane Ida made landfall along the southeastern coast of Louisiana near Port Fourchon around 11:55 am with estimated maximum sustained winds of 150 mph. Areas of southeast Louisiana are still under flood advisories. Additional rainfall is possible over southeast Louisiana as well heat advisories. Hurricane Ida caused devastating destruction across southeast Louisiana. Power outages are wide spread and several parishes are having continuing communication issues. Search and Rescue operations are underway across the region. Damage is still being assessed. Local, state, and federal partners are responding to the needs of the parishes.

STATE ACTIONS: Agencies are monitoring the situation and are on standby as needed.

- Entergy Update
 - Early this morning, Entergy delivered first lights into the Greater New Orleans area.
 - Full restoration will still take time, given the significant damage across the region.
 - Crews will have to methodically bring back additional transmission lines over time to provide other pathways for power to enter the region, helping to maintain stability of the system throughout the complete restoration process.
 - Additionally, crews will continue to work to repair damage across the distribution lines that serve homes and neighborhoods across the region.
 - As of 10 am this morning, there are still approximately 800,000 outages across the Entergy footprint in Louisiana.
 - 148,000 out in the East region
 - 234,000 in Southeast
 - 186,000 in Metro (ENO)
 - 235,000 in South.
 - Assessments are nearly halfway complete for both Transmission and Distribution throughout the state, with the remaining damage assessment expected to be completed by Thursday night.
 - Damage assessment reports indicate heavy damage in the Terrebonne and Lockport, with nearly a third of the damaged poles in those areas and another third in the Reserve and Metairie/Kenner areas.

Cemetery Task Force

- CRTF moved 5 semi trailers of Laura/Delta-recovered caskets and remains from Cameron Parish to a staging area north of I-10.
- LSP supported aerial missions on 9/2 to Plaquemines, Jefferson, and St. John Parishes. Additional missions will be necessary.
- Surveys began in Terrebonne Parish today.
- A total of 8 cemeteries were visited and Ida-caused damage was documented in 2 of these cemeteries.
- A total of 27 graves were documented as damaged, with all of the damage resulting from wind. The damage was limited to tombstone and crypt front damage.
- No caskets or vaults were observed to be damaged.

- Aerial surveys supported by LSP of portions of Plaquemines, Jefferson, and St. John Parishes resulted in the identification of at least 6 damages cemeteries of the 12 surveyed.
- In Ironton's (Plaquemines) 2 cemeteries, 24 vaults are known to be compromised and 9 caskets are exposed. These numbers will likely increase as flood waters subside and terrestrial surveys can be accomplished.
- In 4 cemeteries in the Lafitte (Jefferson) area, 10 compromised vaults were observed, but no exposed caskets were seen.
- In St. John, one cemetery had a single compromised vault and another was not able to be assessed due to tree cover.
- As of today, the total compromised graves documented from this event is 71 and the total cemeteries surveyed is 20.
- Reports received today of impacts in St. Helena Parish. Verification and management of these impacts will occur as conditions permit access.

PARISH ACTIONS: UPDATES SHOWN IN RED

Region 1

Jefferson Parish (*Declaration Submitted 8/27*)

- Public Schools closed until further notice. Catholic schools closed until 9/06.
- POD opened at 8 am – the line is a mile long.
- Have had issues with generators staying on all the time. Trying to put generators on lift stations.
- There are many people with medical-special needs and discharged hospital patients that need to leave the parish. They will most likely need medical transportation, including ambulances.
- 911 and EMS are overwhelmed.
- Workers are having trouble finding fuel for personal vehicles. Need to build out fuel support.
- Mobile Command Post is now in Laffite.
- Displaced caskets in Laffite – once there are confirmed locations, they will request assistance from the state.
- Establishing a base camp in Grand Isle.
- Entergy is going to demo the 9 point mile tower and USCG is going to collect the wires.
- Water is receding in Laffite
- DOTD will establish a ferry near the Kenner bride or establish a pontoon bridge.

- Goose Bayou pump station is destroyed.
- Entergy has completed 40-60% of assessments.
- 190 residents transported to state shelters and 11 to MSNS
- Oschner Medical Campus back on power.
- Damage assessments are ongoing

Orleans Parish (*Declaration Submitted 8/28*)

- Any person evacuated is advised to stay away until further notice.
- Issues with communications and the 911 system.
- Assessing damages and prioritizing buildings at risk for collapse. Activating debris contract.
- Focusing on standing up 8 different cooling centers. Will deploy RTA buses to use for cooling as some centers are having trouble keeping power.
- Focusing on maintaining food and water distribution.
- Maintaining generators is a continuing challenge.
- As people return (despite messaging), there will be a strain on sewer systems. Sewage and Water Board is working on a plan to power lift stations.

Plaquemines Parish (*Declaration Submitted 8/27*)

- Working on debris with DOTD and contractors.
- EOC got a generator installed and has power up. Still no AC and cell service.
- EOC operating out of government complex still.
- 911 is still operating out of the mobile command.
- Can't get anything down to southern end of the parish due to flooding across roads
- Water plant is pumping out water from facility.
- Entergy has help provide generators to water stations. Received more last night from multiple sources.
- Sherriff has put road blocks at parish lines to check residents.
- Received more pumps for back levees.
- LANG is going to use high water vehicles to deliver MREs and Water to southern part of the parish.

- Plaquemines Medical Center – sheriff's office transported some medical staff for emergent issues only.
- Requesting tarps to distribute through fire stations.
- All floodgates open except Empire.

St. Bernard Parish (*Declaration Submitted 8/26*)

- Parish schools and offices closed until further notice.
- Dusk to dawn curfew until further notice.
- Phone and internet service is down (Cox).
- Distributing tarps to residents.
- Entergy is working to restore power.
- 10-12 convenience stores/gas stations and several grocery stores opening.
- Cooling station available for oxygen dependent people – will provide water.
- Hospital is back on commercial power.
- Power has been restored to 20% of the parish.
- Businesses slowly returning.
- Cooling shelter still in operation from 1100 to 1930 hours daily.
- Hospital back on commercial power.
- Crews clearing debris off roadways outside the levee system.

Region 2

Ascension Parish (*Declaration Submitted 8/27*)

- All government entities closed until further notice due to lack of power as of 8/31.
- School is closed all week.
- Curfew in effect
- Shelters are still open. Capacity fluctuating between 80-100 people.
- Shelters may be without power if fuel supplies run short.
- Internet service is spotty.

- Most of the parish is without power. Entergy said there is substantial
- Activating debris removal contract.
- Gas stations limiting fuel purchase to 5-10 gallons.
- PDA team at parish/city building. Public self-reporting using <http://damage.la.gov>.

East Baton Rouge Parish (*Declaration Submitted 8/27*)

- Still have half of the parish is without power, but the situation is improving.
- There are 0 hotel rooms available in the parish.
- Major fuel problems. Over double the population in the parish. Over an hour wait at each fuel station.
- Curfew in effect depending on debris in the area.
- Southern University's sewer pumps went out.
- Public Works cleaning roadways.
- PODs are running locally.

East Feliciana Parish (*Declaration Submitted 8/27*)

- Damage Assessments in Progress.

Iberville Parish (*Declaration Submitted 8/26*)

- Schools closed until 9/07. Parish offices open 9/01.
- A shelter was opened on 9/01 at 5 pm by the American Red Cross at the White Castle Community Center in White Castle.

Livingston Parish (*Declaration Submitted 8/27*)

- EOC on generator power.
- Problems with power outages and debris.
- Shelters opened at Live Oak Jr and Albany High on 8/31 at 1900.

Pointe Coupee Parish (*Declaration Submitted 8/27*)

- Parish Curfew lifted. All major roadways are open. Communications issues.
- No severe damage was reported as of 0945 8/30.

West Baton Rouge Parish (*Declaration Submitted 8/27*)

- Schools closed until 9/03
- Parish has pushed out its online and offline forms for damage assessment to municipalities.

West Feliciana Parish (*Declaration Submitted 8/27*)

- Hospitals and EOC on generator power.
- Communications issues.
- Curfew lifted
- LE assets assisting other parishes through LSA Task Force
- All roads and bridges open
- All parish operations are back to normal.
- Fuel supplies are very limited. There is a huge influx of out-of-town residents seeking fuel and creating LE and traffic problems.

Region 3

Assumption Parish (*Declaration Submitted 8/27*)

- Public Schools will remain closed until 9/07.
- Communication issues with internet and cell service.
- The shelter is receiving more people from Lafourche and Terrebonne.
- Hospitals are sending oxygen-dependent persons to the shelter.
- Workers are also staying in the shelter.
- Fuel is being stretched thin.
- The line workers consume much fuel, and the service stations don't have any. In addition, lines for regular stations are hours long. May need extra fuel assistance.
- Rerouting 911 to a white service and is operational. Still limited phone and internet service.
- **Approximately 150 people in the shelter – Lafourche Parish residents.**

- Establishing debris contractor contract.
- No one on SLECO has power. Entergy probably around 47%.

Lafourche Parish (*Declaration Submitted 8/27*)

- Public schools and offices are closed.
- Curfew is dusk to dawn until further notice as 8/28.
- Multiple roads closed due to down trees and poles.
 - Multiple homes, businesses, and public buildings with damage and roofs off. Widespread structures with catastrophic damages.
 - Due to the damage to the hospitals, the parish may need mobile medical treatment facilities.
 - The water plant has a mainline water break at an unknown location.
 - EOC roof is coming off. Requesting mobile command unit.
 - ARC is helping open a shelter at Thibodaux High School.
 - 115 residents in Thibodaux High School.
 - Requested buses to transport residents to Assumption Parish Community Center
 - Central Lafourche High School shelter shut down.
 - Bad communications issues.
 - Most of the parish still does not have running water or electricity.
 - All of Lafourche except inside the Thibodaux city limits is in a boil water advisory.
 - There are still areas that do not have water access, but the water district hopes to get everyone up and running soon.
 - Roads are clear up to Golden Meadow.
 - POD sites are open at Thibodaux Family Church, Lockport Fire Central, and Our Lady of Prompt Succor Church.
 - Law enforcement and ambulances are back up and running.
 - LPSO Units no longer on roadway and are stationed at various locations.
 - Power is back on at Lady of the Sea Hospital. Only 4 patients in the hospital (ICU), all other patients had been evacuated.
 - There is a boil water advisory from Raceland south.

St. Charles Parish (*Declaration Submitted 8/27*)

- Parish Offices and Schools: Closed
- Communications are down. 4 pump stations are down. Widespread damage.
- Evacuees in state shelters.
- West Bank POD opened this morning. Moving to LA 327 to alleviate traffic issues. Open East Bank POD tomorrow.

- Curfews from 8 pm to 5 am
- Boil Advisory still in effect
- Public Works is clearing roads and debris. Entergy cleared lines on all major thoroughfares
- Water level in Des Allemandes has gone down significantly.

St. James Parish (*Declaration Submitted 8/27*)

- Curfew for St. James Parish, Towns of Lutchter and Gramercy remain in effect from 7pm to 5am.
- Have enough natural gas on the east and west bank.
- Entergy: assessed all transmission lines, and all of the lines are damaged in some way.
- The only significant roadways still closed are due to downed power lines.
- 911 Trunks for St. James are up.
- St. James Hospital is operating on Generator Power. Jail is operating on generator power.
- Limited communications in parish. FirstNet COWs active for first responders. Verizon COW located in Convent.
- Parish and Towns are 100% without power.
- Entergy has completed 90% of their assessment and main transmission lines are down, multiple lines and 340 poles down in the parish.
- All State and Parish roads open to at least one lane for emergency access.
- Contracts for Debris Removal and Monitoring were activated and contractors are preparing to begin initial pickup end of week.
- East Bank and West Bank Parish Water Plants roofs blown off.
- Water plants are operational and entire parish is under a boil water advisory.
- Water system has been 100% on for 24 hours.
- Shelter of last resort opened 8/29 at Lutchter High School - currently 28 residents sheltered.
- Chateau St. James Nursing Home has 104 residents and 55 staff sheltering in place.
- Working on plan for: Generator at EOC is seeping, which operates 911, communications, internet for Hospital. Possibly picking up generator from Assumption parish.
- DOTD working on removing debris and MOU for parish to do it themselves being discussed.
- PODs are operating. Planning to distribute tarps through parish (not at a POD).
- Another gas station coming on line – brings total to 5 in parish

- Main grocery store is out of commission for 3-5 months due to destruction
- Parish public works has been able to clear major thoroughfares. Able to bring resources in via all major highways.
- 48 Parish Buildings have damages from minor to severe. Assessments still ongoing.

St. John the Baptist Parish

- Flooding throughout the parish. Multiple building collapses. Devastation across the parish.
- Lots of damage to roads and critical infrastructure.
- Need aerial flight for an overview of damages.
- Limited email and phone service. Little to no electricity.
- No water – water systems severely damaged by storm surge.
- Some nursing homes are having generator issues.
- Partially evacuated home in Laplace and will finish evacuation today 9/01.
- All debris contracts are in place and active.
- Gas stations are reopening throughout the parish, and law enforcement is watching for possible problems regarding refueling among residents.

Terrebonne Parish (*Declaration Submitted 8/27*)

- Shelter location at Terrebonne Civic Center opened at 6 pm 8/28.
- Terrebonne General and Leonard Chabert Hospital closed and not operational. Will need temporary medical treatment centers. Trying to get Public Health Unit online with a generator.
- Having difficulty getting fuel: workers staying outside parish and driving, ATT cell tower, lift stations – having difficulty with transportation of fuel to sites
- Requesting state assistance with transporting COVID positive/quarantined people to St Mary Parish shelters.
- Communications improving including major cell companies. ATT tower and blimp active today.
- Assessing levees and canals for debris today
- Trying to fix pump stations to avoid future flooding from rainfall
- Hospital is struggling to run AC because there is not enough water pressure for coolers. Also concerned about equipment overheating. There is a fire truck pumping water into the chillers and trying to fix pressure problem. Trying to fix roof.

- Supply warehouse severely damaged. Trying to fix it up and get it up and running. This will get oxygen resources back up.
- Dialysis centers have no power or water and not operational.
- Thibodaux, Donaldsonville, and Kenner open – going to transport patients to the clinics instead of sending them to special needs shelter
- Entergy arrived in parish. Started assessments and hoping to finish Friday.
- No gas stations open. No pharmacies open. Open stores do not have credit card ability (only cash) and bank ATMs are not working.
- A lot of volunteers and NGOs are coming in with supplies, workforces, and food – matter of organizing them and getting them operational. Going to use them to run PODs instead of local volunteers that need to start working on their homes.

Region 4

Acadia Parish (*Declaration Submitted 8/27*)

- All Parish prisoners returned to the parish jail as of 1 pm 9/1.

Lafayette Parish (*Declaration Submitted 8/26*)

- LPSO is assisting Acadian Ambulance with critically ill patients in the Gray and Houma areas.
- Also deployed a rescue boat, one vehicle towing the boat, one marked patrol vehicle, and 10 cases of MRE's to personnel deployed to Gray, LA
- Lafayette Parish Sheriff's Office has deployed the following resources to Gray, LA. Due to no communications (radio or phone) an IMAC has not been done.
- 1 Command/Control/Coordination Specialist, 10 Search and Rescue Specialists, 9 SWAT Specialists, 9 Marked patrol vehicles, 2 LMTV, and 2 HMMWV.
- Delivering the following supplies to Terrebonne Parish:
- 20 pallets of water, 20 pallets of MRE's, approximately 400 tarps, and a reefer truck with 5,000 bags of ice.
- Lafayette 911 sent three PTP 600's to St. John Parish to help set up limited communications. Motorola is assisting with this.
- Lafayette Sheriff's Office is deploying the following to Houma for personnel supporting the Terrebonne Parish Sheriff's Office: Mobile Command Trailer, One-ton utility truck, and supplies.
- Two Lafayette Fire Departments units are delivering 50 boxes of food containing MRE's and snacks to LaPlace EOC.

St. Martin Parish (*Declaration Submitted 8/26*)

- Communications Center Dispatchers receive 911 calls from southeast Louisiana affected areas and transfer information to the appropriate 911 center via 700 MHz radio and cell phone.
- Parts of Lower St. Martin have restored power - SLECA. No 700 radio transmissions. Only Verizon cell phone coverage is working.

St. Mary Parish (*Declaration Submitted 8/27*)

- Parish Offices opened 9/01. Parish school will open 9/07. Charter and private schools will opened in west St Mary Parish 9/01.
- Curfew in effect for Morgan City from dusk until dawn.
- Both hospitals are on generator: Franklin Foundation and Ochsner St Mary's.
- 911 communications and the internet are down.
- ATT lines are down. Cell coverage is very spotty.
- Many gas stations running out of fuel in Eastern part of St Mary. Very long lines at gas stations across the parish. Grocery stores running low also.

Region 6

Rapides Parish (*Declaration Submitted 8/27*)

- Currently, Rapides Parish does NOT have any general population shelter facilities available. Therefore, awaiting the decision of Point-to-Point Parishes (St Mary and Lower St Martin).

Vernon Parish (*Declaration Submitted 8/27*)

- All parish and city government entities have returned to normal operations.
- 8/29 102 residents and staff from Chateau Terrebonne in Houma were evacuated to the Woodlands Nursing Home, 144 Thad Bailes Rd, Leesville, La. This is an ongoing agreement between the two nursing homes.
- Vernon OEP provided 50 cots to the Woodlands Nursing Home to support the evacuees on 8/30. The Woodlands is self-supporting in all other areas at this time.
- 8/30 The Leesville Lions Camp, 292 L. Beauford Dr., Anacoco, La. is currently sheltering 34 evacuees from SE La. parishes affiliated with the Lions Camp. The Lions Camp is self-supporting at this time.

- 8/31 Vernon Sheriff's Office deployed 4 deputies to Livingston Parish to assist with recovery operations.
- Several NGOs are securing donations to send to SE La parishes. Delivery to occur weekend or early next week.

Region 7

Webster Parish

- All Caldwell Parish Offices and Schools are open.
- 8/28 Meadowview Health & Rehab in Minden, LA, received patients from Patterson Nursing Home in Patterson, LA, and staff and some family.
- 8/30 Webster Parish Sheriff's Office has sent personnel to assist St. James Parish Sheriff's Office.

Region 8

Caldwell Parish *(Declaration Submitted 8/27)*

- All Caldwell Parish Offices and Schools are open.
- The Caldwell Parish Shelter (Caldwell Parish Recreation Center) is open and available to take in (50) evacuees.

Lincoln Parish *(Declaration Submitted 8/27)*

- Lincoln Parish Sheriff's Office continues to support daily assignments in St. James Parish. Additional personnel to deploy on Friday, Sept. 3rd.
- Ruston Fire Dept. has two personnel deployed with State USAR Team. RFD continues to support firefighter backfill operations St. James Parish.
- EMBRACE LOUISIANA campaign through United Way, NELA set up with a collection site only at the Lincoln Parish Library Events Center. Operation is to initially support North LA shelter operations.
- OHSEP monitoring situation for support in shelter operations and South LA assistance.
- Shipping water & MRE's as requested in critical need areas.

Morehouse Parish *(Declaration Submitted 8/27)*

- Have a few evacuees at the state park. The state shelter has a few people occupying it.

- 192 evacuees in the state shelter. Still have evacuees at the state park. Morehouse Parish Sheriff Office along with LSP is providing security at the state shelter.

Ouachita Parish *(Declaration Submitted 8/27)*

- Point to point agreements with Plaquemines, St John, and Terrebonne parish initiated.

Union Parish *(Declaration Submitted 8/28)*

- FFD delivered cases of water and MREs to evacuees at D'Arbonne Motel, D'Arbonne State Park, and D'Arbonne Pointe
- Approximately 500 evacuees in those 3 locations
- Delivered cases water to UP Detention Center
- UP Library providing free activity/snack bags for children, coffee/snacks, computer use, free faxes and copies
- TARC of Hammond, LA, adults with disabilities will be at the Lake D'Arbonne State Park for at least next 2 weeks. Delivered 3 cases water and PPE.
- Delivered PPE to Lake D'Arbonne State Park personnel
- Trees of Righteousness will start pickup/takeout meals on Wednesday, September 1 from noon to 1:30p also offering free clothing for children and adults.
- Picked up 6 pallets of water using Read Lumber truck from Ouachita EOC.
- Loaded 6 pallets of MREs to State Representative, Chris Turner for delivery in Lafitte and Laplace areas.
- Loaded 1 pallet water, 18 cases of water and 12 boxes of MREs for delivery in Thibodaux area.
- 22 TARC of Hammond residents staying in Group Cabin at Lake D'Arbonne State Park - First Baptist Church will provide some meals and OEP along with FFD will keep check on their needs.
- Distributed 10 tarps and 12 cases of water to Thibodaux residents.
- Distributed 40 tarps, 15 cases of MREs, and 30 cases of water to south LA residents staying in Union - residents from Houma, Laplace, Larose, Ponchatoula.

Region 9

St. Helena Parish *(Declaration Submitted 8/27)*

- Only recently got some minimal communications back. Still need assistance with communications. 911 communications are still having issues.
- Opened shelter.
- 0 residents in the parish with power. Probably a week before getting power back to towns, 3-4 weeks for all residents.
- Will need a POD.

St. Tammany Parish (*Declaration submitted 8/27*)

- LANG started debris removal. Activated debris contract.

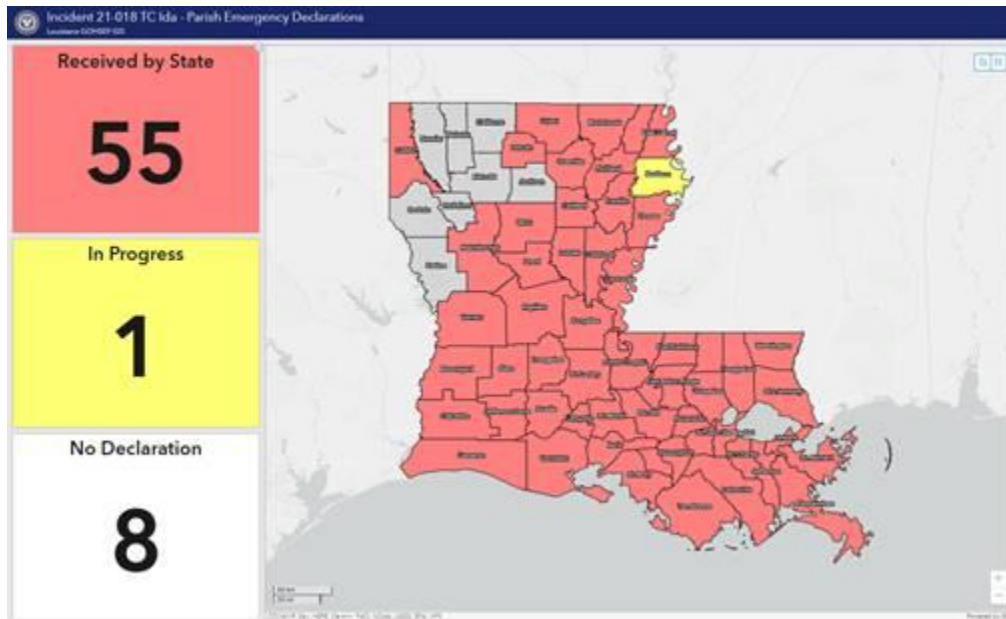
Tangipahoa Parish (*Declaration Submitted 8/27*)

- ARC feeding and BBQ Relief are actively distributing food.
- **4 shelters open.**
- **224 road closers, 15 state road closers.**
- **Debris contract activated and working with Entergy.**

Washington Parish (*Declaration Submitted 8/27*)

- Schools closed until after Labor Day
- Multiple locations had trees removed, and damage assessments are ongoing.
- DOTD and parish crews continue to clear roads.
- Having communications issues still.

- 3 public water systems down.
- Second Harvest will activate Friday.
- A boil water advisory is in affect for the BOUG-LUSA water district, Rural Franklinton and Mt Hermon Water District.
- Shelter at Bogalusa High School – 22 residents.
