

INCIDENT OBJECTIVES

- 1. Ensure the safety of the public and first responders during winter storms
- 2. Clear and maintain roadways to facilitate safe transportation and provide timely information to drivers about road conditions and potential hazards.
- 3. Establish and manage emergency shelters for individuals affected by extreme cold or weatherrelated incidents
- 4. Provide assistance to vulnerable populations, such as the homeless or those without proper heating.
- 5. Monitor and respond to issues related to power outages, frozen pipes, and other infrastructure challenges caused by winter weather and coordinate with utility providers to restore essential services promptly
- Disseminate accurate and timely information about weather forecasts, warnings, and safety measures as well as educate the public on how to prepare for and respond to winter weather conditions, i.e. preventative messaging for pipes, plants, people; fire safety with portable heaters being used: generator and carbon monoxide safety if power is out and generators are running and stay off the roads as they may be passible but dangerous hazards are present.
- '. Ensure the availability and efficient use of resources
- 8. Assess the impact of winter weather incidents on the community and infrastructure to implement recovery efforts and support the community in returning to normalcy.

WEATHER FORECAST




Low Temps Tuesday Morning





Hours Below Freezing + Hours Below 25F






Hours Below Freezing (32F)





Ice Accumulation so far (Estimate)





 Projected Ice Accumulation by 6AM

BLUF Lifelines Summary BLUF

Law Enforcement/Security:

- LSP activated EOC with 24 hours coverage and has Rapid Response Units on Standby with continuous monitoring of WebEOC and ready to respond as needed.
- Staffing levels are double shifts to provide necessary support and response

SAR ESFs:

Food, Water, Shelter

Health and Medical

- LDWF coordinated with Veteran's Affairs to support personnel transport if ice and extended road closures yield support is needed
- OSFM monitoring, ready to support and need info on warming stations to support inspections

Drinking Water:

- Caddo Parish, Simpson Acres Water System on boil advisory; pop affected 48
- Union Parish, Rocky Branch Water System on boil advisory, pop affected 1,410
- Madison Parish, City of Tallulah experienced system wide outage, but since is regaining pressure; pop affected 8,601; nursing home, schools, and hospital on system but no immediate needs at this time
- Evangeline Parish, Bayou Des Cannes / Basile water temporarily turned off at 9:00pm tonight (1/15) to conserve supply and will turn back on tomorrow morning; boil advisory will be in effect when service resumes

BLUF

Hospitals:

- Medical infrastructure remains intact
- · OPH has Pre-staged oxygen in several at-risk regions
- Pre-emptive messaging has been sent to medical infrastructure to include hospitals, nursing homes, assisted living, etc.

- LA 26 West at Chitto Bridge (Oberlin) has begun to ice over and is being monitored

- Continue monitoring <u>www.511la.org</u> for real time data on road closures as well as FB, Twitter or My DOTD for alerts and notices
- Roads are passible but dangerously hazardous. Stay off the roads unless absolutely necessary
- · After 10 PM tonight, 16 total road closures will be in effect.

Region 1: WARMING STATIONS ESTABLISHED

Parish	Location/Details
Jefferson	Tentatively, Warming shelters are being planned at <u>Terrytown</u> and Bright playgrounds. Jefferson Parish has established up to two nights lodging beginning on Monday at two area hotels for any homeless persons. They will be advertising this publicly and have setup a coordinator that the EOC, JPSO and 911 can contact to coordinate relocating anyone in need.
Orleans	New Orleans Recreation District (NORD) will open <u>Rosenwald</u> Recreation Center Annex at 6pm on Monday, 1/15/24 to house those in need from the cold (homeless or otherwise), NORD staff present for set-up by 5PM. This will <u>not</u> be a 24 hour shelter as NORD will resume normal business hours at 9am on Tuesday, 1/16/24. Those housed will be expected to depart with any belongings before 9am and presumably can return for overnight sheltering after 6pm. The current shelter plan will last through Thursday morning. Those needing to warm up during daytime hours can utilize the normal entrance of any NORD Recreation Center. Should <u>Rosenwald</u> Recreation Center Annex lose power, NOHSEP will have a generator present for back-up power. Snack provisions for shelter patrons will be provided by City of New Orleans/NOHSEP.
