**INCIDENT OBJECTIVES**

1. Protect life
2. Ensure the safety of the first responders during event
3. Clear and maintain roadways to facilitate safe transportation and provide timely information to drivers about road conditions and potential hazards
4. Secure and protect vulnerable infrastructure such as public water systems and hospitals
5. Ensure the availability and efficient use of resources

**WEATHER**

- Tropical Depression Francine has moved well to the north and is located over north-central Mississippi as of mid-day Thursday (9/12)
- Winds continue to subside over the southeastern and east-central parishes with some breaks in the clouds through the afternoon
- Weather forecasted to be mainly dry through the weekend, with afternoon temperatures returning to the mid to upper 80's through the next 3 days
- High water remains a problem for a number of communities with the lower sections of most Florida Parish rivers in minor to moderate flood

Safety and Security

**For for Evacuation Areas, Parish Emergency Declarations and School Closures:**

- The public can utilize [www.virtualla.la.gov](http://www.virtualla.la.gov) to stay updated on the latest information as well as [www.emergency.la.gov](http://www.emergency.la.gov)

**Government Services:**

- Parishes are encouraging the public to utilize [Damage.LA.Gov](http://Damage.LA.Gov) to self-report damage related to severe weather event

**LSP:**

- LSP partially activated and CIMS teams operating 24 hour operations
- Troops are assisting DOTD in clearing roadways of hazards and enforcing road closures
- Troops are operating double and/or supplemental shifts in affected areas
- LANG Military Police officers have partnered with Troop B and Troop NOLA to assist with patrol and recovery efforts
- Mobile Field Force and SWAT have been deployed alongside Wildlife and Fisheries agents to Terrebonne Parish and Lafourche Parish to assist with damage assessments
- Air Support Unit is assisting state agencies and parishes with damage assessment flyovers

**DOC:**

- Cameron Parish has evacuated 23 male inmates to Catahoula Parish
- Orleans Parish has evacuated 104 male and 43 female inmates to Louisiana State Penitentiary

**LABEOC**

- Significant losses to the seafood industry in Terrebonne and Lafourche parishes
- Coordinating with wireless carriers for restoration support in affected area
- Provide updates to the private sector as information becomes available
- Private sector survey published by 1500

**LANG**

- LANG has halted increasing the force while analyzing future mission requirements
- Post landfall priorities focus on search and rescue and supporting the commodities distribution enterprises
- Ready to initiate PODS in affected parishes

**LDWF:**

- Total of 90 Agents with trucks and boats ready to respond as necessary for SAR missions

**CPRA**

- Coordinating with the levee districts regarding damage assessments of flood protection systems; supporting levee districts on gate opening as conditions allow

**Jefferson:**

- Hospitals will be in storm activations and will handle as needed. Public Works (PW) departments will continue to empty storm drains as needed. PW departments have staged equipment as needed

**Plaquemines:**

- As of 1230 on 9/12 at ALL evacuation orders are lifted
- Fairy resumed normal operation as of 0630 on 9/12

**St. Bernard**

- Damage assessment team to begin full assessment missions on 9/12

**Firefighting Urban**

- No USAR missions; deactivated Blue IST, TN. Task Force 1, MO. Task Force 1

Food, Hydration, Shelter

**DCFS:**

- DCFS responded to Parish LNO requests: Jefferson, Terrebonne, Tangipahoa, pending request for Lafourche
- Communicating with American Red Cross on shelter support requests
- Communicating with State shelter partners for potential opening of State shelters
- Rave Alerts sent to all caregivers and youth in storm impacted areas: St. Mary, Thibodeaux, Orleans, and Covington
- Foster parent support hotline remains fully operational
- Continued accounting for caregivers and youth until all are identified and assessed as safe or have special needs
- Two residential facilities evacuated on 9/10 The Agape House I (St. Mary) arrived safety to Shreveport hotel; The Agape House II arrived safely at New Orleans hotel
