INCIDENT OVERVIEW

WebEOC Incident: 24-033 TS Francine - Statewide - Sep
Activation Level: 4
State Declaration: JML 24-142

INCIDENT OBJECTIVES

1. Protect life
2. Ensure the safety of the first responders during event
3. Clear and maintain roadways to facilitate safe transportation and provide timely information to drivers about road conditions and potential hazards
4. Secure and protect vulnerable infrastructure such as public water systems and hospitals
5. Ensure the availability and efficient use of resources

WEATHER

- For areas that continue to respond and recover following Francine, scattered mainly afternoon t-showers will continue into Tuesday (9/17) with only isolated afternoon showers for Wednesday (9/18). None of the storms are expected to be severe.
- The rest of the week and the upcoming weekend looks dry. Morning lows for the remainder of the week and the weekend are expected to run in the low 70°s for most of the impacted parishes with highs in the mid to upper 80°s through Friday (9/20).
- Weekend (9/21-22) highs could reach the 90°s under sunshine.

LABEOC

- As of 9/16/2024, has transitioned into normal duty hours
- Final coordination call was on 9/16 at 1500

LANG

- Maintaining mission readiness, and preparing for future operations

LDWF:

- All Agents continue to be on standby
- Agents assigned in affected area will continue to provide support and are ready to respond

LAVOAD:

- Feeding groups continue to coordinate and adjust mass community feeding as electricity is restored
