INCIDENT OBJECTIVES

1. Ensure the safety of all individuals present, including public, first responders, and emergency personnel involved in response
2. Coordinate with ESFs to ensure consistent resource sharing and response
3. Maintain effective communication channels to disseminate information to the public, first responders, and emergency personnel involved in response
4. Protect the environment, wildlife, fishing industry, and coastal infrastructure
5. Adapt objectives based on changing incident conditions to maintain response

WEATHER

Today:

Dry with highs in the 80s. Northeast wind around 5 mph. High Tide 1.01ft at 1641.

Overnight:

Increasing clouds, with lows around 65. East wind around 5 mph. Low Tide 0.3ft at 0211.

Tomorrow:

60% showers and thunderstorms across southern half of state. Mostly cloudy, highs near 79. "Moderate" flash flood threat through Wednesday AM East wind 5 to 10 mph with at gusts at 20 mph. High Tide 0.9ft at 1402.
