

Key Messages

January 24, 2026
10:00 AM

Sat Morning thru Sun night: Wintry impacts

Sun thru Tue: Extreme cold prolongs hazards

Ice & Cold Weather Overview:

- Significant impacts from ice caused by freezing rain likely across northern half of LA; could reach I-10/12 corridor west of Baton Rouge (worst case-scenario)
- New Orleans metro: No ice accumulation. Baton Rouge: Monitoring rain/freezing rain transition Sunday - greater confidence to the north.
- Hard freezes/wind chills: statewide Sun–Tue mornings

Impacts

- Roads/Bridges: Hazardous to locally impossible travel Sat Morning–Sun; black ice/bridge glazing a concern.
- Infrastructure/Power: Tree damage & outages likely across northern LA.
- Duration: Prolonged sub freezing temps in the north may extend travel & infrastructure issues into early next week

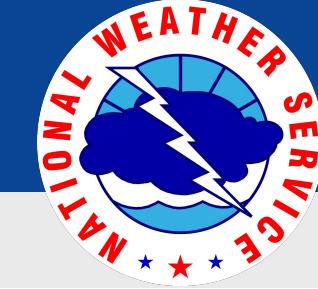
Confidence & Unknowns

- High confidence: Arrival of very cold air, hard freezes, and dangerous wind chills.
- Increasing confidence for significant icing risk across northern LA.
- Lower: Precip type/amounts and just how far south the ice axis gets across central & southern LA.

Cold		EXTREMELY COLD. Lows in the teens north of the I-10/12 corridor to single digits near and north of the I-20 corridor on Monday & Tuesday mornings.			
Wind Chill		DANGEROUS WIND CHILLS. Teens along and south of I-10/12. Single digits to near zero north of the I-10/12 corridor primarily in the morning hours, especially on Monday.			
Freezing Rain		SIGNIFICANT ICE ACCUMULATIONS (>0.25") from freezing rain and sleet likely along and north of a line from Natchez to DeRidder	Ice accumulations could be slow to thaw leading to prolonged travel impacts.	Heavier ice/sleet accumulation areas in North LA will struggle to thaw	Any remaining ice/sleet accumulation melts
Strong to Severe Storms		A few strong to locally severe storms along coastal southern or southeastern Louisiana.

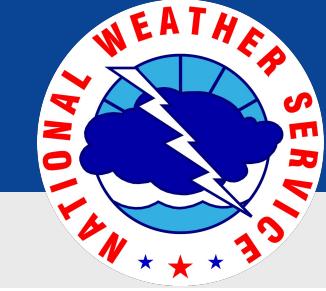

Happening This Morning:

January 24, 2026
10:00 AM

- **Shreveport Area:** We are seeing mostly sleet, and are starting to message higher-end sleet totals across northern LA (generally Mansfield to Monroe) of 1-3" of sleet (probably closer to the higher side). Several scattered instances of 4" of sleet possible.
- **Still concerned about the next wave tonight could still be freezing rain. Significant ice accumulations expected.**



Conditions this Morning

January 24, 2026
10:00 AM

Hazardous, icy conditions to begin across northern LA today



- **Rain spreading in:** Showers move in from Texas
- **Northern LA:** With surface temps already below freezing, icy conditions & sleet will continue. **Conditions will become dangerous today through tonight into Sunday.**
- **Freezing line shifting south:** The freeze line will continue to drift south into central Louisiana this afternoon/evening, bringing expanding icy conditions southward.



Most Likely Scenario Ice Accumulations

January 24, 2026
10:00 AM

Forecast valid Now through 6PM Sunday.



- Significant ice accumulations (between 0.5 to 1 inch) across the northern half of LA with localized ice totals in excess of 1", especially in northeast LA.
- A glazing of ice upwards of 0.1 to 0.25 inches could extend as far south as along a line from Bunkie to DeRidder.
- Onset has begun this morning and will spread southeast through Sat/Sun before clearing out Sunday evening.



10:00 AM

Forecast valid Now through 6PM Sunday.

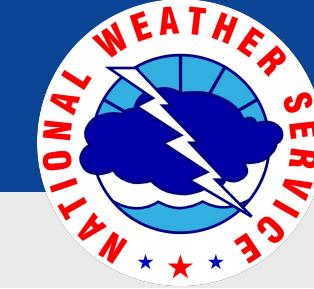


- Destructive ice accumulations (>1") in Northern LA with isolated accumulations up to 1.5" in northeast LA.
- A glazing of ice upwards of 0.1 to 0.25 inches could extend as far south as the I-10 corridor west of Baton Rouge.
- Onset has begun this morning and will spread southeast through Sat/Sun before clearing out Sunday evening.







Winter Weather Headlines in Effect

January 24, 2026
10:00 AM

As of 6AM CST



Northern Louisiana:

- **Ice Storm Warning:** North LA: Ice accumulations of $\frac{1}{4}$ to $\frac{3}{4}$ ", with isolated totals near one inch. Central LA: Ice accumulations of 0.10 to 0.50" expected.
 - Impact to roadways and infrastructure expected.

Southwest Louisiana:

- **Winter Weather Advisory:** Mixed wintry precipitation. Ice accumulations up to 0.10" possible.

Southeast Louisiana:

- **Winter Storm Watch:** Total ice accumulation between a light glaze and locally higher amounts up to one tenth inch possible.



Cold Weather Headlines in Effect

January 24, 2026
10:00 AM

As of 3AM CST



All of Louisiana:

- **Extreme Cold Watch/Extreme Cold Warning:**
 - Dangerously cold temperatures as low as 0 degrees possible across northern and central LA, wind chills as low as 15-25 for southern LA.
 - **Impacts:** Frostbite and hypothermia will occur if unprotected skin is exposed to these temperatures. An extended period of freezing temperatures could cause ruptured water pipes.




Sunday Morning Lows & Wind Chills

Forecast Min Wind Chills




Min Wind Chill Approx Timing
